9. School Facilities

- Buildings and grounds:
 - We have 3 buildings. Our main building house our Front Office, Principal's Office, First Aid Room, Staff Room and Winda Classroom.
 - Our second building houses our Ngani Classrrom, Library and Rainbow Room (Support Room)
 - Our third building, the Malka Room, is for teaching The Arts and Japanese, for SRC meetings, assemblies, and Playcentre on Friday mronings.
 - Most rooms have recently been painted inside.
 - Our toilet block is currently under negotiations for upgrade.
 - The school has both hard surface and grassed play areas and two areas with fixed play equipment. There is a dedicated early years outdoor learning environment surrounding the Malka Room. We have a large COLA (Covered Outdoor Learning Area

11. Local Community

General characteristics

:Booborowie is mainly an established farming community, with limited availability of local employment. Employment is usually available in the larger nearby towns of Burra and Clare. Booborowie is situated 180 kms north of Adelaide, about 30 minutes from the well known Clare Valley and 20 minutes for the historic town of Burra.

Parent and community involvement

:We have a active and involved parent community, with almost all families on Governing Council.

Feeder or destination schools

Most students transition to Burra Community School for secondary school. A bus is provided.

Other local care and educational facilities

Most students transition from Burra Early Learning Centre as they finish preschool.

Commercial/industrial and shopping facilities

: Locally there is a general store, which also sells fuel. Several tradespeople live locally. : Burra has more facilities; however the major commercial and business area is Clare where most types of shops, services and banks are available. :
