Some facts about Harmony Day:


- Harmony Day was first held in Australia in 1999.
- Australians are encouraged to wear orange on Harmony Day. By wearing orange, people
 are showing their support for all cultures that make up Australia.
- Orange is the colour chosen to represent Harmony Day. Traditionally, orange signifies social communication and meaningful conversations. It also relates to the freedom of ideas and encouragement of mutual respect.
- The event of Harmony Day takes place on the 21st of March every year.

The whole school undertook 2 specific learning activities on Harmony Day. We were very excited to share this opportunity and celebrate Harmony Day together. Hayley Holland undertook a lovely and engaging lesson which involved the discussion of positive community values and how these align with our own school values. The students really loved creating their own acts of kindness by creating some positive notes to the Booborowie Community. 



















Mrs. Woolley's Warble

In The Arts, we have finished our Dance unit called 'Lanterns and Lions'. Students explored the cultural elements of the Chinese Moon Festival (also known as the Mid-Autumn Festival) celebrations through a range of practical and engaging skill-building dance and movement activities, culminating in a small group performance of the dance sequence they choreographed. We also practiced giving, receiving and responding to feedback on our work.

We are now finishing off our Drama unit called 'Building Characters'. We are exploring building characters through and for drama. We are using the elements of drama - character, role, situation, and voice in practical ways to develop the our understanding of how character can be understood and what creative ways it can be demonstrated.

Through these two units of work, we will also be develop our life long skills of building on our personal strengths and achievements using feedback and self-assessment, performing designated roles within groups and respecting everyone's contributions to a shared outcome.

In HASS lessons in the Winda class this term, our Geography focus shifted from exploring what is 'place' and how people's perceptions change the way we describe the location and connection to place, to looking at how climate and the characteristics of places influence where we live and our lifestyle, and identifying how and why places are similar and different.

Students have gathered information from different sources, recorded data in tables and graphs, recorded the location and features of countries and places on labelled maps. We have used grid references and BOLTSS on our maps. BOLTSS stands for:

Border - The border shows the edges of the map, and looks like a simple box around the map.

Orientation - The orientation shows the direction of the map. Most maps use a North arrow to show orientation.

Legend - A legend (also called a 'Key') is a list of symbols used in the map with a description for each symbol, telling the map reader what all the symbols mean.

Title - The title tells us what the map shows.

Scale - A scale helps to show the size of the map we are creating, and the distances between points in the map.

Source - Showing where you got the information for your map.

I have also enjoyed my English and Maths teaching in the Ngani and Winda classes! Here are some snapshots of learning below and on the next page!




The Winda students looked at a book called '1000 things to eat'. It was not easy to count the things in the book because of the way the pictures were organised!
